Some background

Default committee spending limit



- Default position is \$200 x number of lots in the scheme –
 which includes GST so 10 lots is \$2,000 GST inclusive
- Principal bodies corporate now include the subsidiary lots at the same \$200 per lot cap
- There is a carve out for insurance providing it has not been made a restricted issue for the committee

Committee spending limits can change Hynes



- The default position can be changed by ordinary resolution no minimum or maximum
- Some easy examples:-
 - General increase or decrease
 - Renovation project (up)
 - Legal fees (down)

The major spending limit



- The major spending limit is statutory. This is the <u>lesser</u> of:-
 - \$1,100 x number of lots in scheme; or
 - -\$10,000
- Can be changed by ordinary resolution
- If spending is under major spending limit (be that committee or GM) – no need for two quotes

Two quote rule



- If spending is more than the major spending limit then two quotes are required – either at GM or committee level
- Needs to be in a same issue motion at GM level
- Carve out for 'exceptional reasons' statutory example is goods of a particular characteristic or only obtainable from one source

Emergency spending



- Has been a slight move away from previous decisions on 'emergency'
- Practice direction 18 requires demonstration of a current, genuine emergency requiring immediate action. It is not a short cut to avoiding normal processes
- Consider also a time abridged EGM

Don't forget



- 'Project' spending if a series of proposals forms a single project the costs are aggregated for spending purposes
- Maintenance as against improvement watch that webinar! Is it like for like?
- Expenditure is not authorised simply because it is in the budget
